

Spelling Strategies

Below are a range of activities that you may use to learn your spellings. Choose methods that work best for you.

<p>Have someone scramble the letters in the word (this is called an anagram) e.g. <i>cat</i> ⇒ <i>tac</i>. You can then unscramble them.</p>	<p>Write your word out. Circle all the vowels and underline the consonants.</p>	<p>Use each of your words in a complete sentence.</p>
<p>Put your words into alphabetical order.</p>	<p>Write your words outside using chalk.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Military Spelling Do star jumps. As you jump, say a letter from the word.</p>
<p>Write each word twice on a card. Then play a memory game with them. Write down the words when you find a pair.</p>	<p>Write your word as many times as it has letters.</p>	<p>Write your words in the air with your finger.</p>
<p>Write the definitions of all your spellings.</p>	<p>Using a timer, spell your words as many times as you can in one minute.</p>	<p>Write silly sentences which include all your spellings in them.</p>
<p>Write all your spelling words together as one long word: <i>onetwothreefourfive</i>.</p>	<p>Download an app such as 'A+ Spelling Test' to support your learning.</p>	<p>Write your spellings in bubble letters.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Spelling Baseball Draw four 'bases'. Have a 'pitcher' pick a word for you. If you spell it correctly, you can move on a base. Four in a row gets you a home run.</p>	<p>Make a set of flashcards for studying your words. Try this website: http://www.kitzkikz.com/flashcards/</p>
