These tasks must be completed over the Summer Holiday.

<b>Task:</b>	Autobiography
<b>Explanation:</b>	<p>To help your new teacher get to know you, we would like you to write a short autobiography. Choose some nice paper and write a short paragraph all about you.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>You may want to include the following:</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;">Who are the people in your family? <b>Task:</b>	Photo for a class display
<b>Explanation:</b>	<p>The classroom is all about you!</p> <p>We would like you to bring in a photo which we will display in the classroom. You might want to choose a photo of you with your family, you doing your favourite thing / hobby, or posing with a pet.</p>

<b>Task:</b>	Times Tables and Number bonds
<b>Explanation:</b>	<p><b>Times Tables</b></p> <p>We use a fun website called Times Tables Rock Stars to help you learn your times tables. We know you have been busy learning your 2, 5 and 10 times tables in Year Two. Using the login details we have given you, login to the website and explore the different games. You will need to design your avatar first and give yourself a cool rock band name!</p> <p><b>Website:</b> <a href="https://trockstars.com/">https://trockstars.com/</a></p> <p><b>Adults:</b> we have created a Times Tables Rock Stars guide to show you how to login - click <a href="#">HERE</a>; it also explains all the different game options. By the end of Year Two, children need to know their 2, 5 and 10 times tables and related division facts. They will need to know their 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables and related division facts by the end of Year Three.</p> <p><b>Number Bonds Knowledge</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know your number bonds to 10 and 20 e.g. <math>2+8 = 10</math>, <math>15+5 = 20</math>.</li> <li>• Know your number bonds to 100 (in multiples of 10) e.g. <math>10 + 90</math>.</li> <li>• Know your number bonds to 100 e.g. <math>12 + 88 = 100</math>, <math>53 + 47 = 100</math>.</li> </ul> <p><b>Useful website:</b> <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</a></p> <p><b>NumBots</b></p> <p>Using the same login details as Times Tables Rock Stars you can login to Numbots. <b>Task:</b>	Spellings
<b>Explanation:</b>	<p>In Year Two you learnt some Common Exception Words. You need to spend some time going over these words and then start looking at the Lower School Word List ready for the Junior School. You don't need to know how to spell all of these words now, but you will need to know them by the end of Year Four. During your first few weeks in Year Three we will test you on the Lower School Word List to help us support you further with your spellings during Year Three.</p> <p><b>Adults:</b> a spelling strategies guide with some different activities has been created to support you. We have also included some flashcards which you could print and cut out to use over the holidays; alternatively you could make your own flashcards with your child.</p> <p>Click <a href="#">HERE</a> for the Year Two Common Exception Words flashcards. <b>Explanation:</b>	<p>Regular reading is very important! Read as much as you can over the holidays. It really does help you with your understanding of vocabulary, writing, spelling and is a key life skill. You might want to keep a list of all the books you read and share them with your new teacher.</p> <p><b>Adults:</b> some recommended reads for Year Two and Year Three have been provided for you.
