



SNAPCHAT FAMILY CENTRE

Whilst Snapchat requires users to be a minimum of 13 years old to use the platform, we know that a number of primary school aged children are exposed to it. We therefore have the following information for parents:

Snapchat has introduced its Family Centre feature to help parents engage with their teens in their digital world. The feature allows parents to easily view new friends their teens have added however it will not show the content of conversations, protecting their teen's privacy. According to Snap, this will, "reflect the way that parents engage with their teens in the real world where parents usually know who their teens are friends with and when they are hanging out."

Using Snapchat Family Centre parents will be able to report accounts that may be concerning directly to Snapchat's Trust and Safety teams. Teens will also be able to notify parents when they have reported an account or a piece of content on the platform.
