This year, we are hoping to build upon their enthusiasm for exploring literature and discovering new texts. Each year group is drawing inspiration from a broad range of sources to support their writing.



SPONSORED EVENT

Each year this very popular event raises funds for the library. We have an extensive, fully computerised library resource within the school, which issues more than 1000 books per week and is visited by every child in the school. Unfortunately, its success does create problems with wear and tear on our present stock, as well as the requirement for us to maintain a wide selection of books that children will enjoy and which will encourage them to read.

This year, we hope that the children will be sponsored to create a 'Reading River', beginning on Wednesday 1st February. Children will be challenged to get as far along the Reading River as they can, by writing anything they read in the stepping stones and lily pads. This activity will promote reading for pleasure and for different purposes, opening children's eyes to the vast range of contexts where reading is useful and enjoyable. It will also support them in making cross-curricular links.

The sponsorship form is included with this letter and should be completed and brought to school on the first day of the challenge. On completion of the challenge, the verified form will be sent home for pupils, (if they are able) to collect sponsorship money, which should be handed in to their class teacher by Friday 10th February. We would emphasise that your support for this event is purely voluntary.

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BOOK FAIR: Thursday 2nd February – Tuesday 7th February (15:25 – 16:00)

We will be holding this year's Book Fair in the Duloe Room (external door near Year Six) from Thursday 2nd February to Tuesday 7th February. You will find an extensive range of children's books, from picture books and novels to graphic novels and non-fiction. Please come along and explore the selection!

AUTHOR VISIT: Monday 6th February

This year, Crosshall Junior School will be visited by none other than Andy Stanton, author of the well-known book series *Mr Gum*. During the visit, Andy will talk about what it's like to be an author, discuss his books, and answer any questions the students may have. This experience will provide valuable insights into the life of an author, which we hope will inspire the children's own reading, writing and creative journeys. Andy will bring 30 signed copies of one of his books. These will be available on a first come, first served basis after school in the Duloe Room, with the Book Fair.

BOOK SWAP: Tuesday 7th February

For the very first time, Crosshall Junior School will be hosting a Book Swap. After school on Tuesday 7th February, families are invited to bring a book (or a couple) they have already read to exchange for a book which another family has brought. Books will be placed on a table under the Year Five canopy in the playground to add to, browse and take from. If a family does not have any books they wish to swap but would like more reading material to own at home, they are encouraged to give a donation to the school in exchange for a book. If it is successful, we would love to run a Book Swap every month to ensure all our children have access to engaging, high-quality texts at home. We look forward to seeing you!

FANCY DRESS DAY: Friday 10th February

Wear a word! On the last day of the week, we are inviting the children to wear a costume related to a word; this could be an adjective (e.g. 'shiny', 'green', 'creative'), a noun (e.g. 'dictionary', 'banana', 'duck') or even a verb (e.g. 'swim', 'fly', 'grow'). The costume can be as simple or as complex and creative as they like. We encourage parents and carers not to purchase anything specific for this activity, as it is a challenge for the children to be imaginative with what they already have at home.
