BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE WEEK - PROTECTING BSL

On Wednesday, some of our pupils took part in a BSL lesson delivered by a Deaf BSL teacher online. Sign Language Week is celebrated every year in March to commemorate the first time BSL was acknowledged as a language in its own right by the UK Government on 18 March 2003. It was not until 28 April 2022, that BSL was finally recognised in law as an indigenous language of Great Britain in the BSL Act (2022). The aim of this year's week was to celebrate and educate people about BSL, to encourage more people to start learning the language, and to protect and preserve BSL for future generations.
