UNLOCKING THE MAGIC OF STORYTIME: CREATIVE STORYTELLING TECHNIQUES

Diving into a book with your child is more than just reading words on a page; it's an adventure into new worlds, an exploration of wild imaginations, and a journey through stories that can last a lifetime. To turn reading time into an even more engaging and magical experience, here are some creative storytelling techniques that can bring stories to life for your young readers.

1. BRING CHARACTERS TO LIFE WITH VOICES

Nothing captivates a child's attention quite like hearing the different characters in a story speak in unique voices. By changing your tone, pitch, and speed, you can help each character leap off the page. A deep, grumbly voice for the wise old owl, or a high-pitched squeak for the tiny mouse, adds depth to the narrative and helps children differentiate between characters, making the story more memorable and fun.

2. EXPLORE THE STORY'S THEMES TOGETHER

Every story offers a chance to explore valuable lessons and themes. Take a moment after reading to discuss what the story was about beyond its plot. Ask questions like, "What do you think the main character learned?" or "How does this story make you feel?" This not only enhances comprehension but also encourages empathy and critical thinking.

3. USE OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS TO SPARK IMAGINATION

Encourage your child to think beyond the story by asking open-ended questions. Inquiries such as, "What do you think happens next?" or "If you were in the story, what would you do differently?" prompt creative thinking and personal connection to the narrative. These questions allow children to use their imagination and become part of the storytelling process.

4. INCORPORATE PROPS AND VISUAL AIDS

Bringing stories to life doesn't have to be limited to vocal variety; props and visual aids can add an exciting layer to your storytelling. Use anything from stuffed animals to represent characters, to simple handmade drawings or objects around the house related to the story. This visual element can enhance understanding and make the story more tangible.

CREATIVE STORYTELLING TECHNIQUES

5. MAKE IT INTERACTIVE WITH ROLE-PLAY

Invite your child to act out parts of the story with you. This could be as simple as making gestures, facial expressions, or fully acting out scenes. Role-playing helps children better grasp the story's events and characters' emotions, making reading a more interactive and immersive experience.

6. PAUSE FOR PREDICTIONS

Before turning the page, ask your child to guess what they think will happen next. This not only builds suspense and excitement but also engages their analytical skills as they try to predict the storyline based on clues and patterns they've noticed.

7. CREATE A READING RITUAL

Establishing a special reading ritual can make storytime a cherished part of the day. Whether it's a special corner of the house dedicated to reading, a specific time of day, or even a unique way of opening a book together, rituals can make reading time something your child looks forward to.

By including these storytelling techniques, reading can become a dynamic and enriching experience. It's not just about the stories themselves but the shared moments of discovery, laughter, and wonder that make reading together so special. So, grab your next book and let the adventure begin!

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
THAT'S MATHEMATICS

That's Mathematics is a maths book like no other. It's a vibrant, colourful book for young children showing them that maths is useful, interesting, fun and EVERYWHERE! They use it every day when they count, share, play, do sport, make cakes or move to music. Aimed at children from 5 to 8 years, the youngest can enjoy it as a picture book, reading Lehrer's rhyming song lyrics and looking at Elina Braslina's joyful illustrations. They will pick up a basic understanding of real-world maths and learn some core maths language along the way.

Older children are challenged to 'Try This' and 'Explore This' by author Chris Smith, who is a maths teacher, musician and all-round maths enthusiast. The activities are designed to deepen their curiosity and knowledge. There are supporting online activities to continue the fun, plus notes for parents to encourage you to get involved and help you discuss topics covered and keep the learning going after the book is closed.




PETS AND THEIR PEOPLE

These are just a couple of the stories in this delightful and surprising collection that profiles the strong bond between humans and their pets. Some of these stories are touching: Frida Kahlo memorialised her pet deer Granizo in her painting *The Wounded Deer*. Some are a little quirky: Albert Einstein, convinced that his parrot, Bibo, was sad, told bad jokes to cheer the bird up.

Each of these wonderfully entertaining stories is made even more appealing by Katherine Quinn's captivating illustrations. Rich in detail and reminiscent of folk art, they capture the humour and poignancy of these fascinating pairings. Together these stories and illustrations will create lasting impressions that will help young readers identify historic figures and spark joy in friendships with the animals in their own lives.



EID

Eid al-Fitr, often simply called Eid, is a significant holiday for Muslims known as the "Festival of Breaking the Fast". It celebrates the conclusion of Ramadan, the holy month during which Muslims fast from dawn to sunset each day. Eid al-Fitr falls on the first day of Shawwal, the month that follows Ramadan in the Islamic calendar.

The timing of Eid al-Fitr changes each year since it's based on the lunar Islamic calendar, which depends on the moon's cycles. The exact date can also vary from one place to another, relying on local religious leaders to spot the moon's first crescent. Usually, Eid starts with the sighting of the crescent moon after sunset. If the moon isn't visible due to clouds or if it's too bright, the celebration is then moved to the day after the 29th day of Ramadan.

This year, Eid al-Fitr is expected around April 11th, but the exact day will depend on the moon's sighting by local mosques or Islamic authorities.




CAN YOU FIND MY EID PRESENTS?

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


PLANET OMAR: ACCIDENTAL TROUBLE MAGNET

DON'T PANIC! WE CAN SAVE THE PLANET


